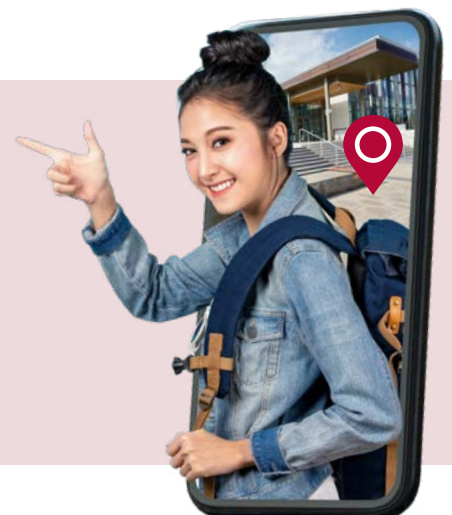

Making connections

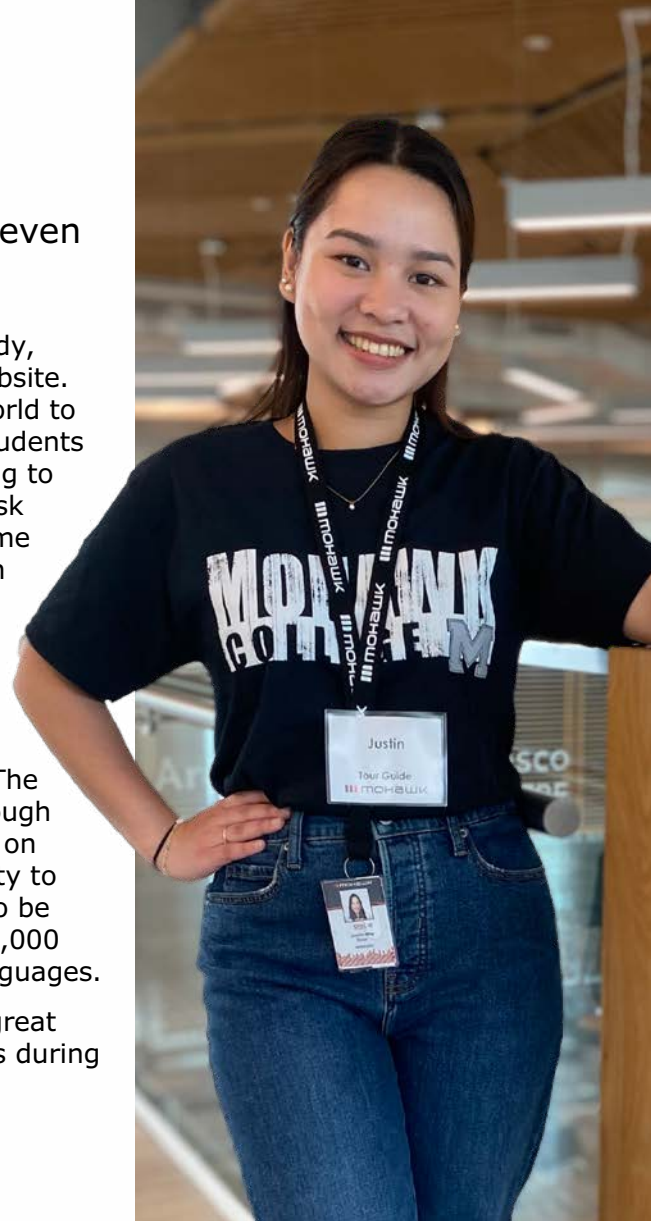
Partnership helps you make connections even before coming to the college.

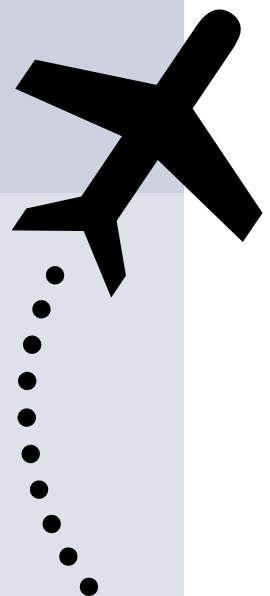

Your step-by-step guide to becoming a Mohawk student

For international students the college application process has a couple of extra, essential steps. Mohawk International is here to help with personal guidance on how to navigate the process. We are available to you as you plan your educational journey in Canada!

STEP 1 Choose your program

Mohawk offers a wide range of more than 100 programs that open career opportunities for international students.

Pay special attention to the deadlines for competitive programs (indicated with **C** beside the program name)—those programs have more qualified applicants than there are spaces. You are encouraged to apply for these high-demand programs as early as possible to be considered for the limited number of spaces available.



STEP 2 Apply via Ontario College Application Service (OCAS)

The OCAS International Application Service (IAS) is an online application process that will only take a few minutes. If you need to take a break, your progress will be saved and you will be able to continue right where you left off when you return. Apply online now at mohawkcollege.ca/OCAS-International.



STEP 3 Confirming your Offer of Admission

When you receive an offer of admission from Mohawk, you must then confirm you accept the offer and pay fees before the due date on your letter. This is done online through the OCAS International Applicant portal. Once you pay the required fees and accept your offer of admission you will receive a letter of acceptance that you can use for immigration purposes.



STEP 4 Receive your Letter of Acceptance

If your application is successful, you will receive a letter of acceptance and provincial attestation letter from Mohawk College. These letters are required for you to apply for your study permit and are official documents for immigration purposes.

Remember to review the document and ensure you fill out all the required steps.



STEP 5 Apply for your Study Permit

With your letter of acceptance, you should immediately apply for your study permit.

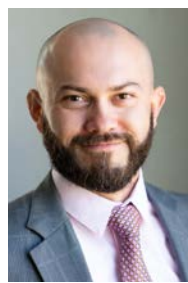

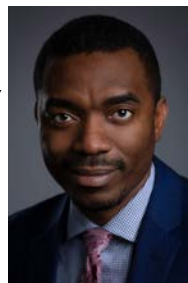

Choose your credential

A credential is the document that confirms you have completed the requirements of your program. Different credentials require different amounts of time to complete. See below for a general time range for each type of credential. How long it takes to complete a program depends on many factors. For detailed information, check your program's web page at mohawkcollege.ca.

Certificates (1 year)

Certificate programs provide an introduction to an area of study and help students develop fundamental knowledge and skills in their field of choice.

Mohawk College Certificates (2-5 years)

Apprenticeship programs

Mohawk offers the required in-class component of apprenticeship training. Apprenticeship is learning a skilled trade on the job, under the supervision of an experienced tradesperson.

Diplomas (2 years)

Diploma programs deliver the theory and practical skills to prepare students for a specific career. Many Mohawk diplomas include an optional co-op.

Advanced Diploma (3 years)

Advanced diploma programs provide additional specialized knowledge in the chosen field. Some Mohawk advanced diploma programs include required co-op.



Degrees (4 years)

Degree programs are offered both directly through Mohawk as well as jointly by Mohawk College and McMaster University. They combine hands-on, applied learning with theory and critical thinking and include work term placements.

Graduate Certificates (1 year)

Graduate certificate programs build on previous postsecondary study to enhance professional skills or develop specializations.

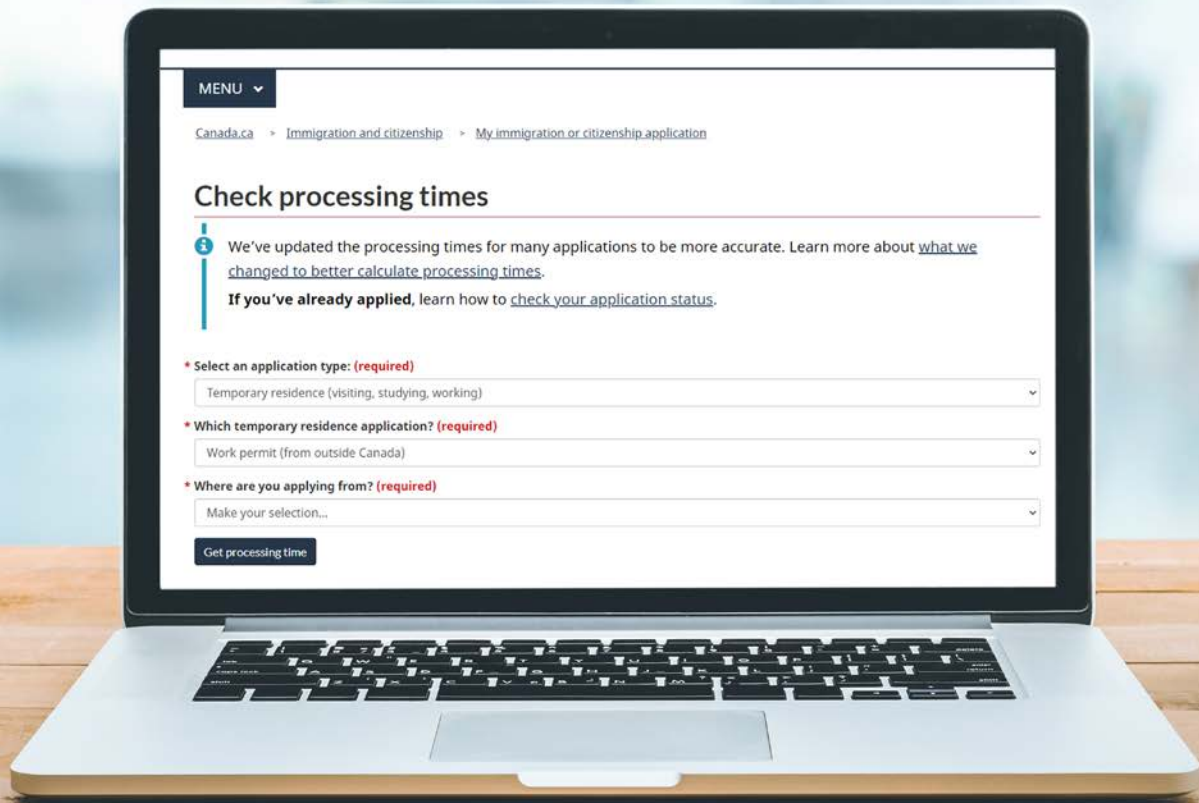
Embrace international culture

International co-op work permit

- If you are an international student and enrolled in a co-op program, you are required to have a co-op work permit before you start your work term. The co-op work permit will allow you to work if it is an integral part of your program and is for credit.
- As an international student, you are strongly encouraged to apply for a co-op work permit as soon as you receive confirmation of your acceptance into the program as it may take up to 6 months for processing times.
- You can check estimated processing times for co-op work permits, but be aware that these times are not guaranteed and are updated weekly.
- Note: When checking processing times, please choose “Temporary Residence (Visiting, Studying, Working)” on the first page and “Work Permit Extension (New Employer)” on the second page.

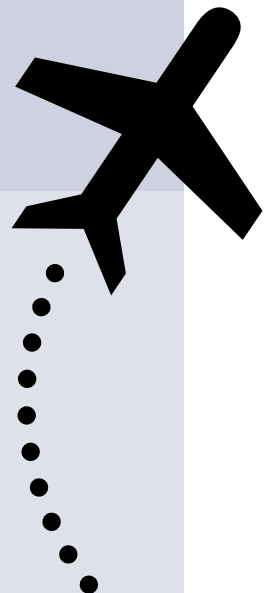

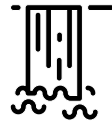
