BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: Assists millwrights with all aspects of their duties (pump work, valves, compressors, chemical metering pumps, etc.). Assists millwrights with installation and repair of piping, booster pumps, well pumps, chemical pumps and valves. Works in storage area to organize parts and take inventory. Prepares and cleans pumps, pipes and motors for painting. Work exposes incumbent to noise and vibration from equipment in booster stations as well as dust, dirt and odours. Wears safety boots, hearing protection and standard issue clothing. Performs other duties as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS, SKILLS, ABILITIES REQUIRED: Has basic mechanical aptitude/knowledge. Reading, writing and arithmetic skills normally acquired through the attainment of grade 12 education. Ability to work independently. Ability to read written direction. Ability to communicate verbally with supervisor, Lead Hands and other workers. Ability to support and project values compatible with the organization. Must have class G drivers license, a clear drivers abstract will be required.

WAGE RATE: \$15.30 - \$19.13 per hour

HOURS OF WORK: 35 hours a week, which includes many weekends (Saturdays and/or Sundays).
