BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES: Assists in all facets of the Water Distribution system maintenance including corrective, reactive and preventative maintenance, with special emphasis on requirements stipulated by the Ministry of Environment. Maintains the regional water services GIS portal which includes locating of various distribution system assets. Prolonged stooping and kneeling are required when repairing and painting of hydrants, sample stations, auto-flushers, valves etc. Work is performed outside 95% of the time, sometimes on road sides, subject to extreme weather conditions, wind, and heat in summer and cold in the spring when performing duties outdoors. Work exposes incumbent to noise and vibration from vehicles, as well as dust, dirt, odours when outside. Wears safety boots and standard issue work clothes at all times and wears safety helmets, gloves, goggles, sunscreen, and standard issue reflective clothing for outdoor work. Performs other related duties, as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS, SKILLS, ABILITIES REQUIRED: Has basic mechanical aptitude, mathematics and science normally acquired through the attainment of a secondary school education. Ability to work independently. Ability to read written direction. Proficient in the use of computers. Ability to communicate verbally with supervisor, co-workers, and occasionally with members of the public. Must have a valid class "G" driver's license, a clear driver's abstract is required. Ability to support and project values compatible with the organization.

WAGE RATE: \$12.86 - \$16.07 per hour

HOURS OF WORK: 35 hours per week, which includes many weekends (Saturdays and/or Sundays).
