- › Sufficient academic preparation and technical experience to be able to master the program material, as assessed by the certificate/diploma admissions committee

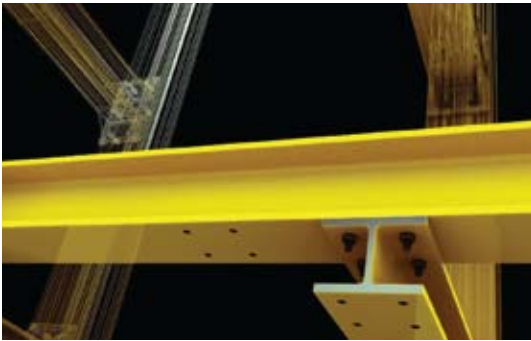
