

If you applied after November 15, 2019,



Pay full amount by the due date, provide your visa approval, and meet academic conditions to secure your spot.



Choose one of the following options to pay your fees

Your total amount owing will change if you opt out of optional ancillary fees when you select your timetable to register. See Terms and Definitions on page 8 for more information.

New and first semester students

Option A: Pay the total amount owing by the tuition deposit deadline indicated on your Fee Statement (found on page 2 of your Letter of Acceptance). Payments made after the due date do not guarantee a spot in the program.

Option B: If your education is being funded by an employer or agency, please attach a letter from your sponsor to your Fee Statement and submit it by the tuition deposit due date on your Fee Statement. Alternatively, your sponsor can send a sponsorship letter on letterhead to international.services@mohawkcollege.ca.

Receipt of your sponsorship letter by the tuition deposit deadline on your Fee Statement will secure your seat in your program and enable you to select your timetable to register.

Second and upper semester students

Avoid a late fee!

Option A: Pay the total amount owing by the tuition deposit deadline indicated on your Fee Statement in your MyMohawk email.

Option B: Pay the \$1,600 non-refundable tuition deposit by the due date indicated on your Fee Statement, found in your MyMohawk email. A \$150 late fee will be charged after the due date listed on your Fee Statement.

The balance is due when you select your timetable, or before January 2, 2020. A \$150 late fee will apply after January 2, 2020.

How you can pay

New and first semester students

- **1. Online wire transfer** Visit mohawkcollege.flywire.com and follow the instructions to submit your payment. Online wire transfers are for payments made outside of Canada.
- 2. Mail Send a certified cheque, money order or credit card number (VISA or Mastercard with expiry date and signature) with the bottom portion of your Fee Statement. Students are advised not to send cash through the mail.
- **3. In person** Bring your Fee Statement to International Square (Fennell Campus) or The Square at any campus and pay with cash, certified cheque, debit card, VISA or Mastercard.

Second and upper semester students

- 1. Online Pay online with VISA or Mastercard. Visit mohawkcollege.ca/fees for instructions on how to pay within MyMohawk. Please see above for Online wire transfer.
- **2. Electronic banking** Take your SBID number (on your Fee Statement) to your banking institution or pay through your banking website. Allow three to five business days for processing.
- **3. Mail** Send a certified cheque, money order or credit card number (VISA or Mastercard with expiry date and signature) with the bottom portion of your Fee Statement. Students are advised not to send cash through the mail.
- **4. In person –** Bring your Fee Statement to International Square (Fennell Campus) or The Square at any campus and pay with cash, certified cheque, debit card, VISA or Mastercard.

TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

Health and dental plan fee - The Mohawk Students' Association (MSA) provides students with extended health and dental coverage as well as other services including prescription drugs, vision care and more. Already have coverage? You may choose to opt out. Visit ihaveaplan.ca and enter "Mohawk College (MSA)" to learn more. In addition to this coverage, you will be covered by guard.me. Visit guard.me/mohawk for more information.

Holdback fee – Students who choose to withdraw from the college must formally withdraw by the tenth day of class to be eligible for a tuition refund less the \$1,600 holdback fee. Lack of attendance does not constitute. a formal withdrawal. Students who withdraw after the tenth day of class are responsible for paying their full fees for the semester. 
Late fees - Colleges in Ontario must follow the Ministry Tuition Policy that includes charging a \$150 late fee for all missed payment due dates. Avoid late fees by paying your fees by the due date. You'll find a list of important dates on the back cover of this publication.

Optional Ancillary Fees - Mohawk College and the Mohawk Students' Association (MSA) offer many services, events and activities to enhance your student experience that

are funded through optional ancillary fees. Read more about optional ancillary fees, including costs and when they are charged, at mohawkcollege.ca/optional-fees. You may choose to opt out of optional ancillary fees when you select your timetable to register, or up to the tenth day of class. Should you wish to opt back in, you may do so at any time by visiting The Square at any campus or International Square at Fennell Campus.

Select your timetable to register

Before you can select your timetable and register, you must provide your visa approval, meet academic conditions, and one of the payment options listed on page 6 must be met.

Step 1: Find out when you can select your timetable

You'll select your timetable online in MyMohawk. Timetable selection dates vary by program and begin as early as Monday, December 9, 2019. Find the date and time that timetable selection begins for your program in MyMohawk on Monday, November 25, 2019.

No computer? No problem! Computers are available in The Square and International Square at all campuses.

Step 2: Select your timetable

Most programs have predefined courses each semester that are grouped together in timetable blocks. Most programs will have a choice of timetable blocks, however, if your program has only one timetable block, you are still required to select that block to complete your registration. You'll also select elective courses at this time if they are required for your program.

Step 3: View your timetable


Confirm your selected timetable and review it before classes start as changes to timetables are sometimes necessary. To view your timetable log in to MyMohawk and select the 'Academics' link, then select the 'View my timetable' link under 'Academic profile'. Once the Add/drop period begins, first semester students can go back to 'Choose and change my timetable' and add their communication course.
