Mohawk College's ECG/EKG Interpretation micro-credential was developed by the Centre for Professional Advancement to address the critical care nursing shortage in hospitals and improve overall quality of care. The program is is delivered over the course two (2) weeks and is designed to provide current healthcare practitioners with the comprehensive knowledge and skill required for accurate interpretation and potential management of ECG and cardiac dysrhythmias.

Program Structure



2 WEEKS OF VIRTUAL LEARNING

Learners will participate in 5 modules of self-directed online modules for a total of 20 hours (approximately 10 hours per week).

Module 1: Cardiac anatomy & Physiology

Module 2: Sinus Rhythms (Rhythms of the SA Node)

Module 3: Junctional & ventricular rhythms

Module 4: A/V heartblocks & pacemakers

Module 5: Medications & other ecg considerations
