

Program Foundations

Mohawk College's Operating Room Assistant (ORA) program is a unique model of flexible education that was developed in partnership with Hamilton Health Sciences & Niagara Health to provide additional Operating Room resources and reduce the significant surgical backlog in our region. The program is delivered as a 12-week competency-based micro-certification consisting of ten (10) weeks of online learning, four (4) full day intensive skills labs in an OR setting, and a condensed clinical placement at their home hospital site.

The OR Assistant Role

Reporting to the Clinical Manager, the Operating Room Assistant works under the supervision and delegatory authority of a surgeon and other regulated surgical team members to facilitate the safe and effective conduct of invasive and non-invasive surgical procedures, ensuring that the operating room environment is safe, that equipment functions properly, and that the operative procedure is conducted under conditions that maximize patient safety. The assistant works with other team members to assist with transferring and positioning patient in preparation for surgical care. They will be responsible for the creation and maintenance of the sterile field through aseptic practices and will be responsible for assembling, setting up and disassembling all surgical cases as well as fully participate in the Surgical Safety Checklist phases of the operative procedure.

Program Structure



10 WEEKS OF VIRTUAL LEARNING

Learners will participate in scheduled class activities 5 days/week for a total of up to 22 hours of synchronous and asynchronous learning. Learners should be scheduled for two clinical observation days per week under the supervision of hospital educators for the duration of their online learning.



4 INTENSIVE SKILLS LABS

Learners will participate in a total of four 8-hour face-to-face skills labs in an OR setting; two at the end of week 5 and two at the end of week 10.



2 WEEK CLINICAL PRACTICUM

Learners will participate in a 2 week clinical practicum at their home hospitals under the supervision of staff educators.

Following completion of the program curriculum and on-site clinical practicum requirement, participants will continue building their competencies during a robust OR clinical orientation developed and delivered by the hospital partners.
